## **Basic Law for the Federal Republic of Germany** 23. May 1949

## **Chapter I: Basic Rights**

## **Article 3** [Equality before the law]

- (1) All people are equal before the law.
- (2) Men and women have equal rights. The state shall seek to ensure equal treatment of men and women and to remove existing disadvantages.
- (3) Nobody shall be prejudiced or favoured because of then sex, birth, race, language, national or social origin, faith, religion or political opinions. No one may be discriminated against on account of their disability.
